Had he told the truth about himself and Leslie Brownlee, who attempted an ascent of Mt. Hood on January 1, the 20-year old boy might have been found. As it was the searchers were thrown off the track, acted on misinformation and struggled in vain in their determined search.

To what extent Feyerabend is morally responsible for the loss of a human life may never be fully determined but there are several suspicious circumstances that reflect on him and are suggestive of sinister motives.

Again we are reminded that "honesty is the best policy," that untruth will sooner or later be revealed, that it is foolish and may be criminal to let pride lead to falsehood.

MAINTAINING A GOOD POSTURE

A Good New Year's Resolution.

One of the simplest and most effective methods of bettering one's health is by maintaining an erect posture, says the United States public health service. Posture is an expression of the mental and physical state; also posture may modify and control mental states. The cultivation of a happy, cheerful, optimistic nature more readily achieves results when efforts are also made to walk with an elastic, springy step, to hold the head erect, and the abdomen flat. In an erect posture the body muscles tend to remain taut, and afford a proper support or pressure to the body including the circulation of large blood vessels. In a habitual slouching posture the blood of the abdomen tends to stagnate in the liver and the splanchnic circulation causing a feeling of despondency and mental confusion, headache, coldness of hands and feet, and chronic fatigue or neurasthenia, and often constipation. One of the most important of all health habits is the habit of keeping good posture. When the head droops a strain is placed on the back of the neck and shoulders. When the shoulders stoop the chest becomes flattened and the lungs are cramped for room. When the body slumps forward at the hips the organs are not held in natural position. At the same time the muscles are working a little harder than if the body were erect, for they are making an effort to hold the body from falling forward.

A good posture can not be maintained unless the muscles are kept strong by exercising. If the shoulder muscles are too weak to hold the shoulders in their normal position the chest tends to drop in. If the muscles of the back and abdomen are not strong the body slouches forward. It is not enough to have an erect carriage and a well-poised head. We must also in action should be placed on the ground with the line of direction parallel to the line of movement. The toes should point forward and neither be turned outward or inward.

Games, outdoor sports, such as walking, swimming, basketball, handball, tennis, and golf are excellent remedies for poor posture. The setting up exercises of the U. S. army, if practiced daily, will help the muscles do the work of holding the body in a healthful position.

Good posture pays because it improves health, increases your economic value, gives you social standing, and inspires you with the spirit that wins. "Therefore, be it resolved that in 1927 I will establish the habit of maintaining a good posture."

At the State Legislature

plete new buildings, start the normal school ordered by the voters, fund the institutions and keep things moving along in government operations.

Group discussions at the capitol and in hotel lobbies hit regularly on this need. Nearly a million short, and quick action is up to the legislature.

Men elected to this session are a commanding lot of citizens, viewed from the standpoint of character and personal achievement. That most of them are experienced business or professional men who have not been mere politicians, is evident. Such a legislature is likely to work on sound business lines and do what a commercial organization would, i. e., cut down expense or provide more revenues.

Representatives from the farm counties say they will oppose further land taxes. Proposals for incorporation tax increases are expected to be advanced, but the city dwellers' fear rate increases if the excess tax plan is applied. Some highpower debate is predicted.

Governor Patterson's message carried no explosives, but puts taxation first among subjects for consideration. The expansion of the automobile and traffic department puts the new executive in the position of increasing the number of state offices, but the growth of litigation is stated to be clogging the work of Secretary of State Kozler's department.

If the new division is created, it seems probable that Sam Kozler will be named to head the bureau of automotive and traffic supervision. This would place the appointment of the secretary of state as secretary of state in Patterson's hands—an important fact, for whoever is named will have a shade the best of it in the nomination before the next election.

Recognition of the necessity for segregation is general. It has become necessary to provide quarters for the license and traffic department outside the capitol building. The second floor of a building six blocks from the state house has been selected and equipped. Similar growth made it advisable at Portland to take the auto license division out of the courthouse and into another building. If Kozler is named to direct this department his salary will be higher than at present as secretary of state.

Appointments by Patterson are being kept in the background, with the exception of Hal Hoss, of the Oregon City Enterprise, named as secretary to the new governor.
