Portland Jeweler Must Serve Time Frederick L. Miller, Portland jeweler, who was convicted and sentenced for the death of Mrs. Alma Hall, an aged resident of Fairview, the result of an automobile accident in 1924, was denied leniency by the United States supreme court.

Under the Oregon law conviction for involuntary manslaughter carries with it both a fine and jail sentence. Miller was sentenced by Judge Phelps to a minimum fine and 15 months in the state penitentiary, after the jury had disagreed at a previous trial.

The attorneys for Miller indicate that he is now ready to surrender himself to begin the serving of the prison sentence. He has been at liberty on \$2500 bail since the time of the accident three years ago.

Keep Your Foot on the Clutch.

Keep your foot on the clutch despite what experts tell you to the contrary. If the traffic is great, keep your foot on the clutch. Don't take unnecessary chances on the highway or in the street; glide over the bumps, thus saving your machinery; and don't forget your brake. Caution is the first law of good sense, when it has to do with 40-horse power. Approaching an intersection, remember clutch and brake.

Youths make daring drivers. They go rapidly and easily, with fearless abandon and nonchalance. But they have an undue share of accidents, because they don't think enough of clutch and brake. Oh, yes! there are disasters through confusion, and through timidity; but they are not the disasters of the young driver. Ninety-tenths of the wrecks come from going too fast.

A good driver will keep control of his machine at all times. He can stop quickly but without a shock. He can go slow, as he must when others might be endangered by his fast driving, but can step on the gas and leap ahead when there is opportunity.
