At the State Legislature

Irrigation Legislation. Denton G. Burdick introduced in the house a measure (H. B. 43) placing approval of irrigation certificates in hands of state treasurer instead of certification by irrigation and drainage commissioner.

No Diphtheria in Oregon by 1930. (Oregon State Health Board.) The Oregon State Board of Health at its annual meeting in Salem, Tuesday, January 11th, adopted this slogan and placed itself on record favoring an intensive campaign for the eradication of diphtheria.

The highest attention of diphtheria administration are agreed that diphtheria can be practically made to disappear by a simple and harmless procedure. Science has developed an agent which will protect susceptible persons, especially the young, against diphtheria.

In the effort to eradicate diphtheria by the end of 1930 it will be necessary to immunize or protect every susceptible child in the state. Diphtheria is a scourge which has a most insidious and one of the most fatal in its course.

NOTICE OF SCHOOL DISTRICT BOND ELECTION.

Notice is hereby given that at the School District bond election hereby called to be held at the Union High School Building in the city of Gresham in and for Union High School District No. 2, of Multnomah County, Oregon, on Saturday, the 23rd day of January, A. D. 1927, between the hours of two o'clock p. m. and seven o'clock p. m. there will be submitted to the legal voters thereof the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness in the sum of one hundred and five thousand dollars (\$105,000) for the purpose of providing funds with which to erect and furnish a school building in and for said District.
