A WRONG TENDENCY.

An outstanding feature in the annual report of the Industrial Accident Commission in California is the recommendation that the state compensation insurance be given a monopoly in writing workmen's compensation insurance.

This is certainly a wrong tendency. State accident insurance is a good thing, but why make it a monopoly? It's another instance of the state going into business and because it is profitable cutting off all private competition.

Why should the state in a free country, attempt to crush the business of its citizens? asks The Manufacturer. Why is it not better that the state fund be required to compete with private companies, as the surest means of keeping the state insurance activities in a healthy condition, free from political dry rot that immediately afflicts any monopolistic governmental function?

One of the strongest arguments against enlarging the power of public officials to monopolistic proportions, is the mere fact that the officials themselves seek this enlargement of their authority.

It is easy for the private citizen to give up rights; it is hard for him to get them back. The minute he closes one avenue of private enterprise, he has limited his future possibilities by that much.

Already the advocates of state insurance are working hard to establish compulsory automobile liability insurance; and immediately that is done, we will see the same drive made, first, to have the state write the insurance in competition with private companies, and, second, to have the state create a monopoly of the business to the exclusion of private companies.

Thus, another branch of business would be taken over by the state to the exclusion of its private citizens, and to the enrichment of thousands of new public officials.

Continued from page 1 seven members, one from each school district of each of the local districts embraced in Union High School Dist. No. 2, and one at large, all to be elected for one year or until their successors are elected and qualified.

The Executive Committee shall organize by electing one member as chairman, also one member as vice chairman, either one of whom shall preside at all meetings, also elect a secretary and treasurer, or a secretary-treasurer, who may or may not be a member of the executive committee.

Duties—It shall be the duty of the Executive committee to keep in touch with all matters outlined above and to keep the members advised from time to time as to current events of interest as recited above, and it shall be the duty of the secretary to keep a record of all deliberations in a record book provided for the purpose, and the treasurer shall keep a true account of all moneys received and disbursed on the order of the executive committee.

Meetings—An annual meeting and election of committeemen shall be held annually on the fourth Saturday in January each year in the city of Gresham, Oregon.

All committee meetings shall be called meetings, either by the chairman or on the order of three members of the committee.

It is further agreed, that any other or all rural school districts in eastern Multnomah county may have representation on the Executive committee, if desired, by complying with the foregoing requirements.

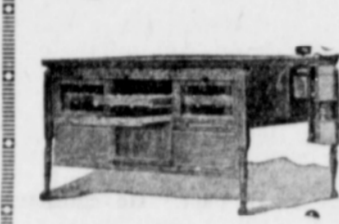

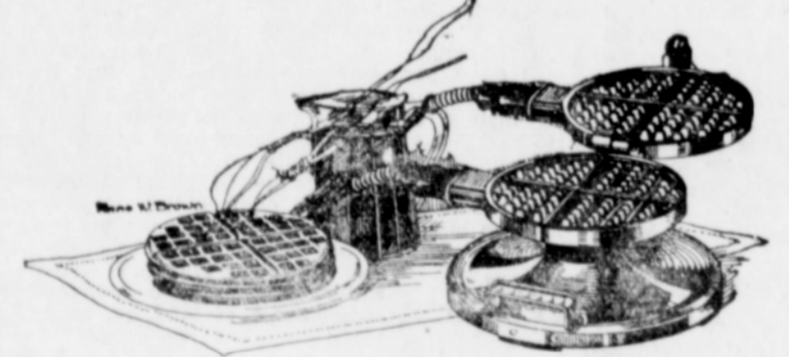
