ABRAHAM LINCOLN.

Again as the anniversary of his birth dawns the nation turns its thought with a heartfelt thankfulness to that towering character—Abraham Lincoln. With the added perspective of the increasing years he stands against the background of history ever stronger in his manly personality and the magnanimity and wisdom of his work.

So far no popularity-seeking writer has cast a blot or reproach upon the purity of his life or unselfishness of his motives.

The mystery of his tragic and untimely death cannot be fathomed but, like the Man of Galilee, perhaps his death was necessary to make him a complete savior of his country.

A few of his great sayings may well be re-read and pondered: "I feel that I cannot succeed without the Divine blessing, and on the Almighty Being I place my reliance for support."

"I must stand with anybody that stands right; stand with him while he is right and part with him when he goes wrong."

"I do the very best I know how, the very best I can and I mean to keep doing so until the end. If the end brings me out all right, what is said against me won't amount to anything."

"Die when I may, I want it said of me by those who know me best, that I always plucked a thistle and planted a flower, where I thought a flower would grow."

REVIVALS.

This is the favorable season for revivals in our churches. While these efforts should undoubtedly be continuous there may be special seasons of effort for the church to fulfill its God-given mission, just as there are special seasons for business effort and appeal.

The fact that two churches hold special meetings at the same time is not to be taken as undue rivalry, any more than the holding of their various regular services at the same hour. Perhaps if all held simultaneous meetings a greater impression would thereby be made on the community.

It is a happy condition, locally and generally, that churches are no longer fighting one another but recognize differences in church individuality. There should be no difficulty in finding an acceptable church home and each individual should be commended to the church home that answers to his or her conviction and preference. It would be ideal if each one found a church home and if possible a family church home.

There are many reasons for diverse opinions but they can be subserved to a broad spirit of helpful cooperation. Neither modernism nor fundamentalism, or anything these ideas imply, should divide a church or a family. A church should be aggressive in its efforts to unite and uphold in the spirit of Christ.

John Wesley expressed what would seem to be a good ideal for all. He said:

"I will not quarrel with you about opinions. Only see that your heart is right toward God; that you know and love the Lord Jesus Christ; that you love your neighbor and walk as your Master walked, and I desire no more. Let my soul be with these Christians, wherever they are and whatsoever opinions they are of. Whosoever thus doeth the will of my Father in Heaven, the same is my brother and sister."

"Mounted" Patrol Use Cars Instead of Horses

Their uniforms may not be as brilliant, but their work is just as colorful as that of the Canadian Mounted Police. Their organization is too young to have the traditions of the Texas Ranger behind it but they are making interesting history every day. They ride a "beat" that stretches from the pleasant coasts and cliffs below San Diego to the blazing heat of Sonora desert east of Yuma over trails that even those hard bit Spanish pioneers of long ago christened the "Jornado del Muerto," journey of death.

They are the boys of the Border Patrol of the United States Immigration Service, who, 24 hours out of the 24, and 365 days of the year, watch the Mexican Border for Uncle Sam to see that no unwanted aliens "crash the gate," and make their way illegally into this country.

Four or five years ago there were only 16 men employed on the Border Patrol between Tia Juana and the point 60 miles east of Yuma where the southern California district ends. Then came the passage of the Johnson bill restricting immigration from the European nations, and where the patrol before had the single task of keeping out smuggled Chinese, there was added the much more difficult job of barring the way against natives of a dozen European nations. Entrance to Mexico is open to any alien and from Mexico thousands of Europeans who have been unable to obtain legal entry to the United States yearly attempt to cross the line.

Today there are 71 men in the Border Patrol in this district. They are mounted, not on horses, but with a fleet of Chevrolet cars, recently purchased for their use by the government. Hitherto the men have owned their own cars but a late change in policy led to the purchase of the Chevrolet fleet for their use.

Few persons are aware of the tight watch maintained on lonely mountain roads, on dim tracks through the desert or the high meadow lands of San Diego's back country. You never know where you will find the Border Patrol at work, which, of course, is decidedly inconvenient for the men who make a business of smuggling aliens.

The very first trip of one of the Chevrolet fleet, for example, resulted in the arrest of three smugglers and two Chinese.

It is no easy job, this Border Patrol service, and has more than its share of long hours, danger and discomfort. It requires a degree of initiative, of tact, of quick observation and resolute courage that not every applicant for the work possesses. The men long in the service develop an uncanny skill in picking out aliens.
