

Bible Conference at Saron Lutheran

Next Sunday will mark the beginning of a Lutheran evangelistic conference to be held at the Saron Lutheran church. It will extend over Tuesday and Wednesday of this week. The services Sunday morning will be in charge of Miss Anna Anderson, who is home from China on a furlough. She was a field evangelist in the province of Honan during the worst days of the war. She will address the Sunday school at 9:45 and the congregation at 11, both services to be in English from the subject of "Prayer." There will be no evening service.

The conference will continue on Tuesday with sermons on the subject, "The Prodigal Son." The theme of the conference is so arranged that sin, conversion and forgiveness will be thoroughly explained. Illustrated hymns and special music are being prepared. The Tuesday night services will be held in Swedish and English, but on Wednesday evening only English will be used.

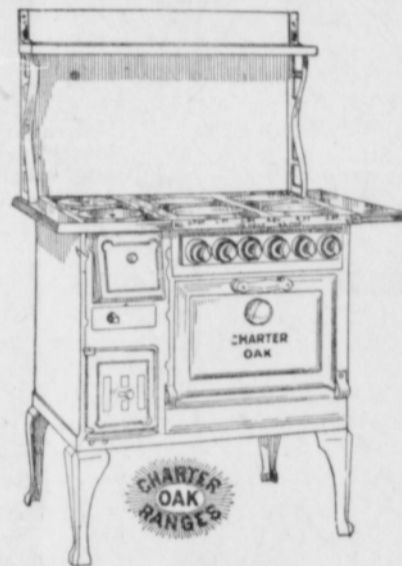
