PASS IT ALONG.

Many of the main highways of the state have been freshly oiled and motorists have experienced considerable grief from injury to their tires.

This situation is taken cognizance of by both the highway department and the Oregon Motor association and helpful suggestions are made.

The Oregon State Motor association suggests that after driving eight or ten miles over a freshly oiled highway the motorist stop and with a screwdriver or other instrument dislodge the sharp rocks that have collected in the creases of the tires.

The oiling of the highways is necessary. The gravel or fine crushed rock is spread over to hold the oil and improve the surface.

The state highway department has carried on a series of investigations to remedy the situation and arrived at the conclusion that both oil and gravel are necessary to the motorist.

This condition is purely temporary and will only exist while roads are freshly oiled and only causes trouble for a few days after the gravel has been spread.
