NOTICE OF SCHOOL MEETING

Notice is hereby given to the legal voters of School District No. Four of Multnomah County, State of Oregon, that a School Meeting of said district will be held at Schoolhouse, on the 12th day of November, 1927, at 2:30 o'clock in the afternoon for the purpose of discussing the budget hereinafter set out with the levying board, and to vote on the proposition of levying a special district tax.

The total amount of money needed by the said district during the fiscal year beginning on June 21, 1927, and ending June 30, 1928, is estimated in the following budget and includes the amounts to be received from the county school fund, state school fund, elementary school fund, special district tax, and all other moneys of the district:

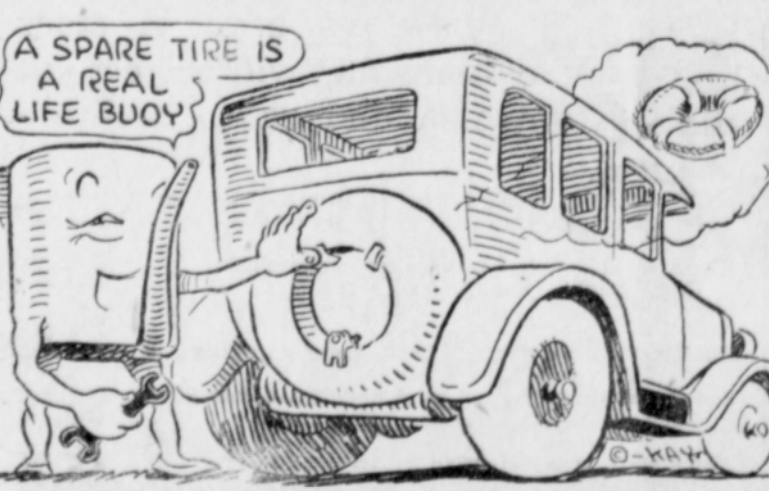
