EDITOR'S BLINDNESS HELPS TO SUCCESS.

We are glad we know Frank Irvine. Everybody knows B. Frank Irvine, editor of Oregon Journal. He has achieved a wide acquaintance and a measure of success that would be remarkable for a man who wasn't afflicted as he is with total blindness.

His story is worth knowing. It is furnished the Outlook through the courtesy of the American Magazine for November where a splendid tribute appears to this beloved, kindly editor of one of the northwest's leading dailies.

"When blindness came upon me," he says, "not one of the things I had thought for years might happen did happen. I did not drop out of the current of life; I did not become a parasite on my family; I did not lose my business. Instead, I began to find out that I could depend upon myself and I began to get a confidence in myself that I had never had before."

Irvine tried out teaching, telegraph operating, clerking and dairy ranching before he finally succeeded in getting into the newspaper business in a small way in towns including Scio, where he was born, and later in Corvallis. When a young man and a railway station agent he suffered an unintentional blow in the eye in a friendly boxing match with a railroad fireman. The eye grew worse and incontinent blindness barred him from every venture he attempted. An operation restored the eye and he started his Corvallis newspaper but soon the other eye began to dim and then gradually became worse. During another trip to see a specialist in San Francisco, 30 years ago, total blindness came on suddenly.

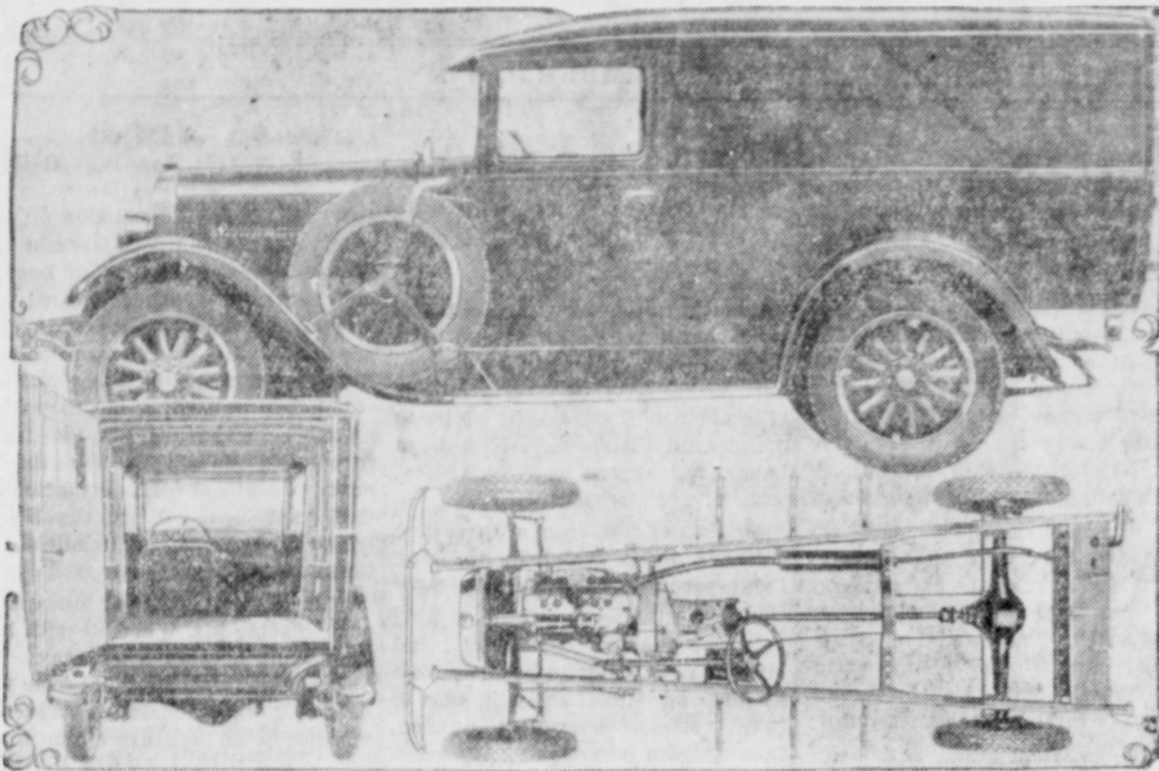
"Now," he said to himself, "I don't have to worry any more about my eyes. I know what I am up against and I am going straight ahead."

Irvine returned to his paper in Corvallis determined to make it bigger. He also made himself bigger. Mrs. Irvine became his "eyes." "I gave special attention to farming topics," he said. "One day I wrote an article on the cooperative movement started by a handful of apple growers at Hood River, Oregon. They were the first in the west to point the way to cooperative farm marketing. Many western growers—notably the citrus fruit growers of California—are now banded together under such a system."

"The article on the Hood River growers, as I remember it, was just a plain explanation of the methods, struggles, and accomplishments of the farmers. Mr. C. S. Jackson, publisher of the Oregon Journal, saw it. He wrote at once and asked if I wouldn't write similar articles and editorials regularly for the Journal. I lost no time in getting some copy to him. Every line I sent was used."

"Finally, in September, 1907, he asked me to come to Portland and write editorials for the Journal." "My dream had come true! I accepted on the spot, rushed back to Corvallis, leased the Times for a year and returned with my family to Portland. I later sold the Times."

University Press Will Honor Joaquin Miller.

"Joaquin, et al." the first published volume of poems by Joaquin Miller, has been selected as the work of the advanced class in printing at the University of Oregon. Under the direction of Dr. John Henry Nash, noted printer of San Francisco, who is a member of the faculty of the school of journalism, and Robert C. Hall, superintendent of the University press, the students will set up type by hand, and print the book.

The selection of the volume was made by E. E. Brodie, Oregon City, Dr. Nash, R. W. Sawyer, Bend, and Earl C. Brownlee, Forest Grove. These men constitute the committee which has charge of the work made possible by donations subscribed by leading newspapermen of the state.

The book, which contains many of the noted poet's best works, is now very rare, and a copy was finally found here in the library of George Melvin Miller, brother of Joaquin Miller. It is a small, beautifully bound and printed book, and is dedicated to Mr. Miller's parents. It was set up and printed by Carter and Himes of Portland in 1869. George H. Himes, now curator of the state historical museum, is still living.

The volume is the second to be turned out by the advanced class. Last year "Education and the State" by the late President Prince L. Campbell was the selection. Only a few copies are printed to be distributed to the donors of the fine arts printing fund and to important libraries.
