**Hillsview District Adds to Schoolhouse**

An addition to the Hillsview school, Dist. No. 83 Jt., which nearly doubled its capacity and provided an adequate social center for the neighborhood was completed in time for the beginning of the school year on September 12. It is a room 26 x 32 feet in size, while the former one-room building is 36 x 40 feet. Folding doors have been provided between the rooms, so that they can be thrown together for public gatherings. A basement under the new part and a part of the old has been developed. A part of it is used for furnace room and the remainder has been provided with tables and other facilities for the serving of suppers in connection with entertainments, one of which has already been held. The improvements were made at a cost of \$3500.

The members of the school board and patrons of the district are much pleased with the efficient work done by the contractor, Oscar W. Thoren of Gresham. J. Green, also of Gresham, drew the plans and made the blue prints.

Miss Gertrude Sharkey is principal of the school, and Miss Pauline Heacock is primary teacher. The school board consists of E. Tillstrom, chairman; W. T. Sharkey and W. J. Milner, A. E. Forsyth, the present clerk, has held the office continuously since 1910. The board is backed by the loyal patrons of the district who wish to make the school as up to date as possible.
