Cottrell Resident Is Laid to Final Rest

The many friends of the late Elmer Van Fleet were saddened to learn of his death which occurred at the family home in the Cottrell community February 28, following more than a month's illness.

Elmer Ellsworth Van Fleet was the son of T. H. and Luellen Van Fleet and was born in Gentry county, Missouri, April 15, 1868. The family resided in Iowa and later in Nebraska and came to Oregon in 1891, settling first in Powell Valley and moving to Cottrell two years later.

Early in young manhood he was converted while residing at Walla Walla, Washington, and joined the Methodist Episcopal church. Upon coming to Cottrell, he joined the Methodist church at Pleasant Home and continued a faithful member until death.

The deceased rendered notable service in church, Sunday school and school district. For 35 years he was treasurer of the Sunday school. He was a valued and energetic member of the Parent-Teacher association. Because of his many and varied activities and interests, he will be greatly missed.

Mr. Van Fleet is survived by his widow, Mrs. Ora Van Fleet; two sisters, Mrs. Margaret Edwards of Cannon Beach, Oregon, and Mrs. Ella Shetterly of Ashland, Oregon; a brother, Neal Van Fleet of Los Angeles; two nephews, two nieces, and a foster sister, Mrs. Cena Canning, of Richmond, California.

Funeral services were conducted yesterday afternoon at the Pleasant Home M. E. church. Music was furnished by C. E. Rusher who sang, "I Shall Know Him," and a quartet, Mrs. Ray Wilkinson, Mrs. Mary Johnson, H. Lee Ball and W. B. Cory, with Mrs. Oliver Gill at the organ. The pallbearers were James Oger, William Craswell, Fred Wagner, Martin Lennartz, W. E. Markell and H. L. Douthitt. The floral offerings were many and beautiful. The body was interred in Pleasant Home cemetery beside those of his parents.
