UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT BOND ELECTION NOTICE.

Notice is hereby given that at the Union High School District Bond Election hereby called to be held at Gresham Union High School building in and for Union High School District No. 2 of Multnomah County, Oregon, on Friday, April 13, 1928, between the hours of 7 o'clock p. m. and seven o'clock p. m. there will be submitted to the legal voters thereof the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness in the sum of \$37,500 for the purpose of remodeling the present high school building and erecting an assembly hall adjoining thereof and thereto, and for furnishing the same, in and for said school district.
