C. W. Baumgardner is enjoying a visit with a brother and wife from Colorado. The brothers had not met for 37 years.

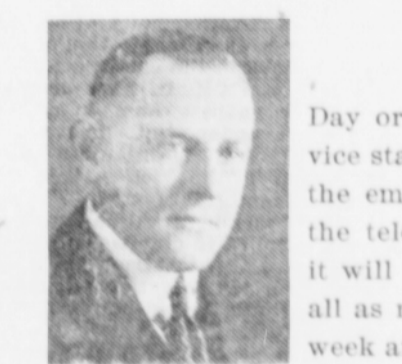
County School Superintendent Thompson, of Deschutes county, was a recent guest of Mr. and Mrs. H. L. Moody.
