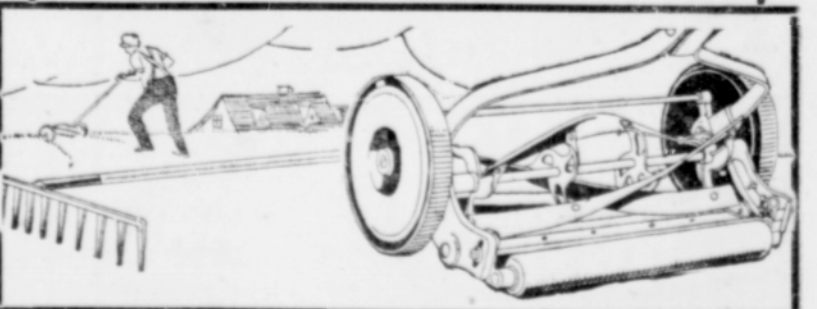

ELECTRIC LINE IS EXTENDED EASTWARD

Residents on the Section Line and Kane roads east of Gresham are highly elated over the fact that electric lighting is now assured them. Agitation for electricity in this section has been going on for the past three years, but only until recently have any actual developments taken place. Holes are now

being dug for the poles and it is thought that within the next month the arrangements will be complete.

The 12 to 15 families to be benefited by the current are doing their part well and have signed up for the necessary equipment which would warrant the company making the extension. Houses are being wired and everything is in readiness as far as property own-

ers are concerned.

The line is being run by the Portland Electric Power company east on the Section Line road to Kane road, thence north about a mile to Hall road.
