Cut worms on tomato plants are best controlled by the application of a small handful of standard bran mash poison near each plant at the time of setting out, says an authority of the State Agricultural

college. A standard arsenate of lead dust, sold ready mixed under various trade names, is applied to repel the small black flea beetles which eat holes in the leaves and often destroy the plant.

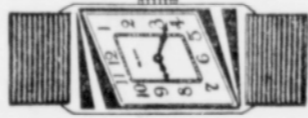

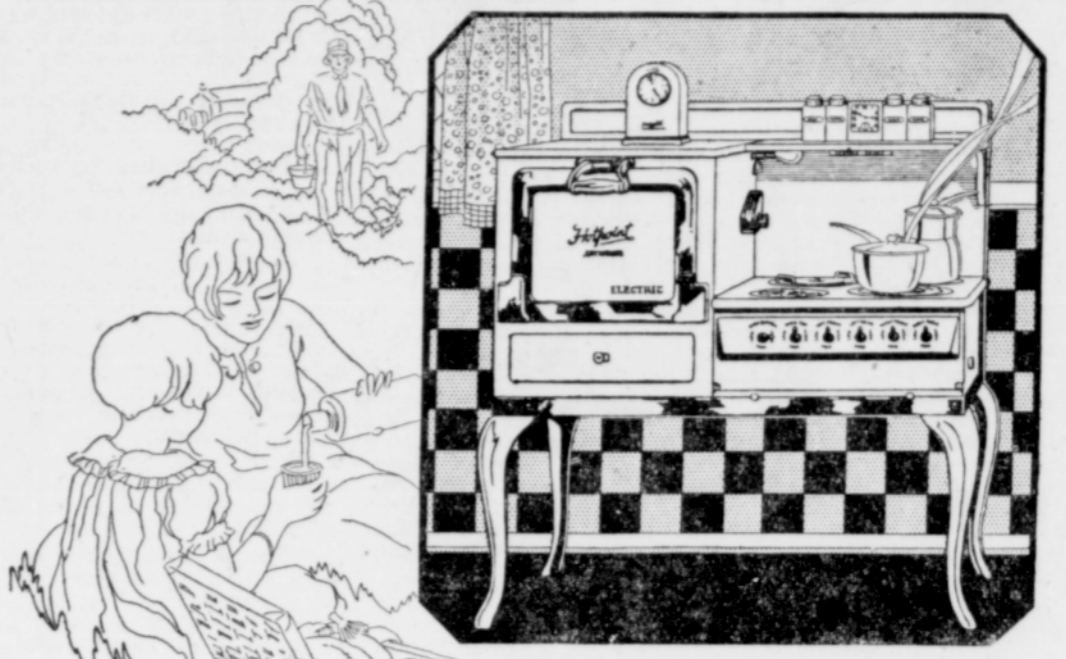
