

**MRS. DAN W. MICKLEY OF TROUTDALE DIES**

Lillie E. Mickley, wife of Dan W. Mickley, died at her home at Troutdale, Wednesday evening, October 10, at the age of 53 years. Mrs. Mickley, who had been a resident of Troutdale for 35 years, was born in Minnesota, August 28, 1875. She had been in poor health the past two years, suffering from pulmonary tuberculosis.

Mrs. Mickley was active in many social affairs up until the time of her illness and will be well remembered by many friends both of Gresham and Troutdale and near vicinities. She leaves her widower, Dan W. Mickley of Troutdale; two sons, Raymond A. of Troutdale, Dan W. Jr., of Portland and two daughters, Lulu Mae of Troutdale and Mrs. Grace Della Hanna of Portland.

Funeral services were held from the Metzger chapel this afternoon at 2 o'clock with Rev. H. V. Wilhelm, pastor of the Methodist church of Gresham, in charge of the services. The services at the Douglas cemetery, where the body was laid to rest, were under the direction of the Eastern Star, of which Mrs. Mickley was a member for the past five years.

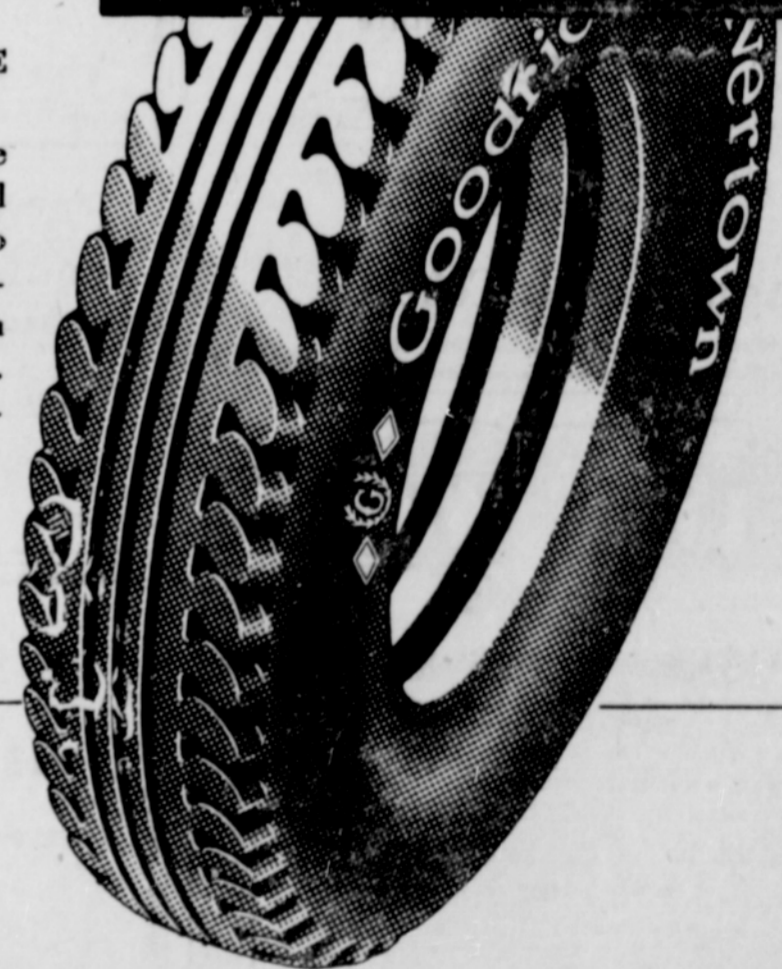
