**OUR OBLIGATION**

The recent speech of Premier Lloyd George in the British house of commons on the question of the Man Power bill now pending, should be read by every American, and read carefully. There is much in this speech to give serious thought.

Lloyd George practically admits that Great Britain is making little if any headway toward winning the war, and that England is nearing the limit of her resources in men! The bill proposes to call men of 50 and boys of 18. The speaker is careful to state that not all the older men will be sent to the front, but that they are needed to take the places of the younger men who can participate in the fighting.

In this emergency, America's duty is plain. We can no longer sit back and wait for the allies to stop the German hordes. We are as vitally interested as they, and have as great a stake in the final outcome as any one of the European nations.

Certainly no person of average intelligence could doubt for a moment that the fate of America is now indissolubly linked with that of the allies. Certainly none can doubt that allied defeat would prove a staggering blow to American progress and prosperity, if not to her very existence as a free nation.

America must win the war. Her power must be the added force that shall turn the scale in favor of the allied cause. To that end all her immense power must be exerted. President Wilson has assured our allies that our armies will be rushed to Europe as fast as it is humanly possible to put them there.

But while our fighting men are hastening to the fray, there is also a herculean task for every man, woman, boy and girl who remains at home. We must work—work and save. We must feed our troops and provide them with all the necessities of war. And we must practically feed the allied world. There is no escaping the obligation. The cause is our own, and the man who shrinks now must forever bear the brand of the slacker and the coward.

**PUBLIC NOTICE, UMATILLA PROJECT.** OREGON, Department of the Interior, Washington, April 3, 1918. Annual operation and maintenance charge. In pursuance of Section 4 of the Reclamation Act of June 17, 1902 (32 Stat., 388), and acts amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto, particularly the Reclamation Extension Act of August 13, 1914 (38 Stat., 886), announcement is hereby made that the annual operation and maintenance charge for the irrigation season of 1918 and thereafter until further notice against all lands of the Umatilla Project, Oregon, under public notice (except lands of the Third Unit, West Extension, under public notice, dated February 7, 1918) shall be a minimum charge of \$2.75 per irrigable acre, whether water is used thereon or not, which minimum charge will entitle the water user to not exceeding four acre-feet of water per irrigable acre; additional supplies to be furnished for 50 cents per acre-foot. All operation and maintenance charges under the project will be due and payable on March 1 following the irrigation season; but where water-right application is made for public land entered under the reclamation law after June 15, or where water-right application is made after August 1 for land in private ownership, no operation and maintenance charge will be made for water delivered during the remainder of the irrigation season in which water-right application is made.
