**Copying Our National Parks.**

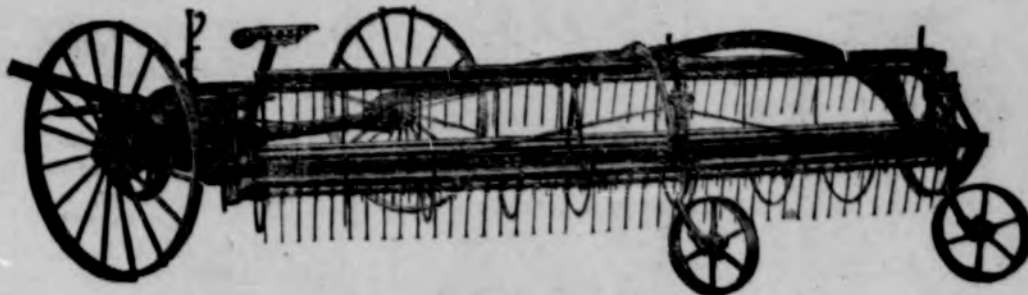

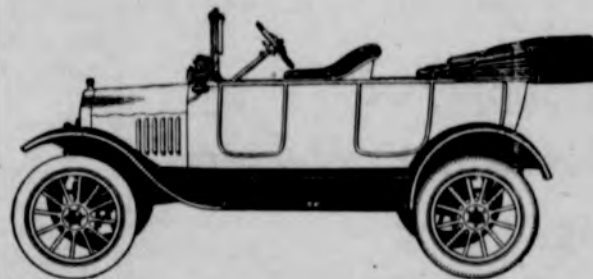
