Cows Officially Tested

Two hundred and sixty-two Oregon dairy cows, representing five breeds and 52 herds, were officially tested in April. Three breeds—Jerseys, Guernseys and Holsteins—from 19 different herds, won honor and rank by reaching the standards set by the national breed association. "This indicates that Oregon dairy cows are uniformly good," says S. Fine of the agricultural college, in charge of official tests for the various breed associations.

Victory Loan Medal

The editor of The Herald has received a Victory Loan Medal from the government for services performed by this paper in the loan drives. It is minted from a captured German cannon and has engraved a picture of the White House and the American Eagle, underneath which is the inscription, "Victory Liberty Loan."

Rare Bank Note.

A rare English bank note is in the possession of a Mr. Vesey Holt. The note is dated 1821 and is the issue of the Bank of England. After the Napoleonic wars England was short of gold, and as a temporary expedient the Bank of England put a number of five dollar bank notes into circulation, until the gold reserve was restored. In appearance they closely resemble a twenty-five dollar note, and bear no likeness to the English paper money of today.

Birth of Great Organization.

The first organization under the name of the Young Men's Christian association was effected June 6, 1844, in England, due to the efforts of George Williams, for the purpose of prayer and Bible study. Library and reading room were later added, and lecture and other courses provided. The association in America is the outgrowth of the English movement in 1844. The organization in America now has almost a million members.

The sweetest singer among birds is the nightingale; then comes the linnet, the lark, the skylark and woodlark. The mocking bird has the greatest powers of imitation.

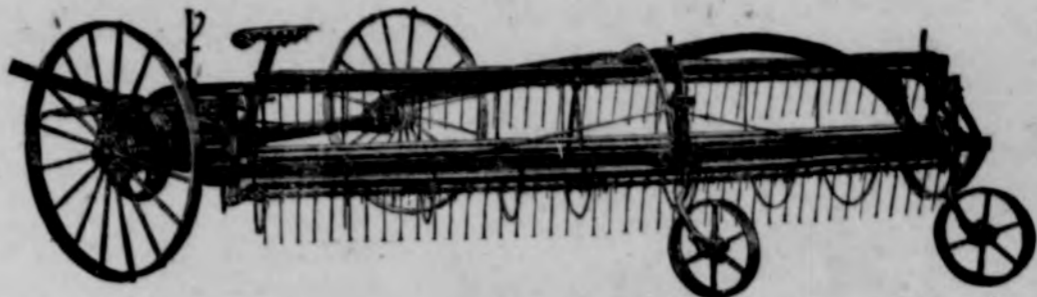

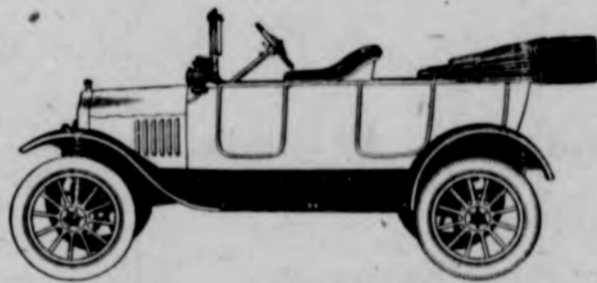
