**RIVER TRANSPORTATION**

The following article was clipped from the Portland News, and has a great deal of food for thought to our own country. The Columbia river is navigable from the coast to Lewiston, Idaho. In the early days there used to be a warehouse in Umatilla which was a distributing point for all of Eastern Oregon. The new freight rates will surely bring back river transportation and a distributing point will be located at Umatilla, where all freight consigned to points east of Umatilla will be transported to that point on the river and on train from there to its destination.
