PRUNING DEMONSTRATIONS PLANNED BY COUNTY PROJECT LEADER, SPECIALIST

"The injury following the severe low temperatures of last winter has rather up-set the pruning dope among the fruit growers and while we never could agree on the correct methods of pruning trees, fruit growers have more divergent ideas than ever now," said J. F. Slover, county project leader of horticulture to C. L. Long, extension specialist, on a recent visit to the Freewater district. "What we would like to have," continued Mr. Slover, "is some pruning demonstration work before the pruning season begins this winter." Accordingly Mr. Long suggested that a two day pruning school be held at Freewater in some orchard at which the extension specialist could prune a number of trees according to his ideas and let a number of the best fruit growers prune a few trees according to their own viewpoint, mark these trees and see what the fruit yield will be on these trees in subsequent years. This suggestion met with hearty accord from the County Project Leader and tentative arrangements were concluded for the holding of such a school early in December.

In order to give the west end of the county the benefit of the same work it is proposed to hold one day school at Stanfield and Hermiston. This will meet with hearty support on the part of the west end fruit growers who feel that they have been somewhat neglected during the past. —Umatilla County Farm Bureau News.
