ORDINANCE NO. 101

To submit to the legal voters of the City of Hermiston measures proposed by the common council and now on file with the City Recorder of said city, to be voted on at the next ensuing general election to be held within the city on the 2nd day of November, 1920, and to direct the publication of said measures, together with this ordinance, and to provide a title for each of said measures and the ballot numbers and ballot titles thereof.

THE CITY OF HERMISTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1.—That there be submitted to the voters of the City of Hermiston all measures herein proposed to be referred to the people of the City of Hermiston by the common council and now on file in the office of the city recorder, to be voted upon at the general city election to be held in said city on Tuesday, the 2nd day of November, 1920, between the hours of 8:00 o'clock a. m. and 8:00 o'clock p. m. of said day, which said measures, together with the ballot numbers and ballot titles thereof, are as follows:

BALLOT TITLE
The following is the form and number in which the measure will be printed on the official ballot:

REFERRED TO THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF HERMISTON BY THE COMMON COUNCIL.

Charter amendment limiting the amount of warrant indebtedness that may be authorized by the common council for street and other public improvements and uses to five per centum of the assessed valuation of the city. Vote YES or NO.

The full text and title of said measure is as follows:

A BILL
To propose by referendum to the people of the City of Hermiston an act to amend Section 72 of the charter of said city, entitled "An Act to incorporate the City of Hermiston, Umatilla County, State of Oregon, and to provide a charter therefor, and to repeal all acts and parts of acts in conflict therewith," adopted by the people of the City of Hermiston at a special election held in said city on the 15th day of March, 1910, and ratified by the common council of said city on the 16th day of March, 1910.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF HERMISTON:

Section 1.—That Section 72 of the charter of the City of Hermiston be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 72.—No money shall be expended, or payment made, from any fund of the city, except special assessment funds, until a specific appropriation shall be made therefor, and an ordinance making an appropriation of money must not contain a provision on any other subject. All demands for interest on the bonded indebtedness of the city and other fixed charges shall be paid as the same mature, or in accordance with the terms of the contract. The common council shall have power, by ordinance, to limit the expenditures of every department of the city government, except interest charges and other charges fixed by contract or by this charter, during each fiscal year, or during any month thereof, and any contracts made, debts created, or liability incurred in excess of the amounts authorized by the council, where the council may so limit the expenditures of money, shall be null and void. The city shall issue no warrants or other evidence of indebtedness for any purpose whatsoever in excess of five per centum of the assessed valuation of all property of the city, except in special assessment funds, unless there is money in the treasury duly appropriated and applicable to the payment of the same upon presentation; provided, however, that in case of epidemic, disaster by fire or water or other emergency, the council shall have power to create special emergency funds and incur liability on account thereof in excess of revenues provided by ordin-

ance. The council shall have power and authority by ordinance to order and contract for street improvements and other public improvements which it may deem expedient and necessary for the public welfare and to provide for the payment of the same by the issue of city warrants on any fund provided therefor, not exceeding the limit of warrant indebtedness herein prescribed.

Section 2.—All acts and parts of acts in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

The full text and title of such measure is as follows:

A BILL
To propose by reference to the people of the City of Hermiston by the common council an Act to amend subdivisions 11 and 14 of Section 101 of the charter of the city, entitled "An Act to incorporate the City of Hermiston, Umatilla County, State of Oregon, and to provide a charter therefor, and to repeal all acts and parts of acts in conflict therewith," adopted by the people of the City of Hermiston at a special election held in said city on the 15th day of March, 1910, and ratified by the common council of the said city on the 16th day of March, 1910.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF HERMISTON:

Section 1.—That subdivision 11 of section 101 of the Charter of the City of Hermiston be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:
Subdivision 11.—No lot, part hereof or parcel of land shall be assessed for any local or special improvement in excess of the actual cost of such improvement as apportioned to said land and in just proportion to the cost of the entire improvement of the local improvement district in which such land is situated, except upon the express consent of the owner of such land, or his duly authorized agent, first obtained in writing.

Section 2.—That subdivision 14 of section 101 of the Charter of the City of Hermiston be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Subdivision 14.—Where the estimated assessment against any lot, part of lot or parcel of land for any local improvement, appears to the common council as excessive or out of proportion to the special benefits to be derived to the property by reason of such local improvement, and where the improvement of a street in any local improvement district appears to the council to be of general benefit and value to all the inhabitants of the city, the common council may, by ordinance, appropriate a sufficient amount from the general tax or special tax funds of the city to pay for so much of the cost of such local improvement as shall not be provided for by assessment upon the property specially benefited by such improvement, and the council may, by agreement with the property owners in any local improvement district, provide for payment by the city of a just and fair proportion of the cost of improving any street or roadway within the city. The council shall also have the power and authority to create a special fund from the general fund of the city for the purpose of paying all or such portion of any street improvement as it shall deem just and fair to the city and to the property owners specially benefited thereby, and also for the purpose of keeping the streets, so improved, in repair. The council may, by ordinance, whenever expedient or necessary to complete any street improvement undertaken by it, authorize the issuance of warrants in payment therefor and fix the terms and conditions of payment by the city and by the property owners specially benefited by any such improvement.

Section 3.—All acts and parts of acts in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 2.—The city recorder shall immediately cause to be published in the Hermiston Herald, a weekly newspaper, printed and published in said City of Hermiston, a complete copy of this ordinance, including all the measures embodied herein, together with the ballot titles and ballot numbers thereof, which publication shall run in two consecutive issues of said newspaper issued prior to the general election to be held in said city on November 2, 1920.

Section 3.—Whereas, a great deal of cement sidewalk is now in course of construction on the streets of the city and a number of petitions are pending and praying and urging the city to improve the streets by grading and graveling before the time for extreme cold weather; and whereas, the streets are now in a rough, broken and dangerous condition and it is necessary for the preservation of the health, peace and safety of the inhabitants of the city that said measure mentioned in this ordinance be submitted to the voters of the city on the 2nd day of November, 1920, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the council and approval by the mayor.

Passed the common council this 6th day of October, 1920.
