Public Notice
Umatilla Project, Oregon, District No. 34

Department of the Interior, Washington, D. C. November 4, 1920.
1. SUPPLEMENTAL CONSTRUCTION: Under the provisions of the Reclamation Act of June 17, 1902 (32 Stat., 388), and acts amendatory thereof, or supplementary thereto, particularly section 4 of the Reclamation Extension Act of August 13, 1914 (38 Stat., 686), a majority of the water right applicants and owners of the land included in District No. 34 of the Umatilla Project, Oregon, have made agreements providing for an increase in the cost of viding for an increase in the cost of construction in the sum of forty dollars (\$40) per irrigable acre. This increased cost is for the concrete lining of what is known as the "DH" lateral for approximately 300 lineal feet, and the relocation and reconstruction of said lateral for approximately 970 lineal feet; also the construction of 1350 lineal feet of new lateral from the "D" canal, in order that water may be delivered as near as practicable to the commanding points of the various units in said district, all of which supplemental construction will involve a cost of not to exceed forty dollars (\$40) per acre of irrigable land.

2. RATIFICATION: The said agreements are hereby ratified and confirmed and the said increase in the construction charge of forty dollars (\$40) per irrigable acre is hereby made effective in accordance with the conditions of the said agreements and as herein specified.

3. LANDS EFFECTED: The lands in the district, all of which are subject to said increased charge, are described as follows:

4. PAYMENT OF INCREASED CHARGE: Such increased charge of forty dollars (\$40) per irrigable acre shall be added to the construction charge against the land in question and be paid in additional annual installments after the last of the installments of the present construction charge, being eight annual installments of five dollars (\$5) per irrigable acre each.
