Tested Cow Shows Quality
The 1644 cows tested in the ten Oregon cowtesting associations for January averaged 396.5 pounds of fat, as shown by the report of E. B. Fitts, extension dairyman of the agricultural college.

The best herd was R. Saling's of the Nestucca association, with an average of 1130 pounds of milk and 50 pounds of fat.

The champion cow was Jack Downing's three-year-old grade Jersey Tootsie, of the Columbia River association, with the remarkable record of 85.15 pounds of fat. The highest milk record goes to J. R. Hawes' registered Holstein, Fanny, for her yield of 1581 pounds carrying 64.82 pounds of fat.

The Champion registered cow was Dolly Dimple, P. A. Lux's Jersey who won her third consecutive honor with a fat record of 68.75 pounds. She is in the Bandon association.

Honors for the highest average yield goes for the third consecutive time to the Rogue River association with 559 pounds and fat 29.13 pounds. This association also continues to lead in number of honor cows, above 40 pounds of fat, with 44 reaching the standard.

Several of the associations are reorganizing for another year's work. Considerably higher averages should be obtained this year by weeding out the poorer cows and paying more attention to feeding, says Professor Fitts. Five cows were sold for beef in January and three purebred bulls and one purebred heifer were bought. The associations are: Clatsop, Tillamook, Nestucca, Smith-Umqua, Coquille and Myrtle Point No. 1, same No. 2, Coos Bay, Rogue River, Bandon Cooperative, and Columbia county.

Poultry Demonstration Flocks Make Good

The highest record in egg production made by the 10,127 hens on the Oregon poultry demonstration farm for January was 20.05 eggs averaged by the 443 white leghorns of Harry Cook, Clackamas county, reports H. E. Cosby, poultry extension specialist of the state agricultural college.

The average of the whole number of hens was 11.58 eggs, making a total of 117,331.

The ten highest flocks averaged 15.54 eggs per hen for the 4082 foyls comprising them. This was a total of 63,447 for the 1233 hens and the 2849 pullets on the ten farms.

The average number of hens on the ten highest farms was 408.2, and the average labor hours per flock was 89.2.

Tree Protection Hops

Mechanical protectors are good on young trees on new ground, as they ward off attacks of cut worms, bud weevils, click beetles, and other pests that prey on opening buds. Protection from ants that carry the aphids into cherry trees is recommended by the entomologist of the O. A. C. experiment station. Cotton baton strips about 5 inches wide and long enough to reach around the tree are endorsed as excellent. Tie the band loosely at the lower edge with a string, grasp the upper edge of the band and roll it down over the lower edge. Tree tanglefoot is also recommended. A band three-fourths of an inch wide is about right. If too wide the bands will injure the young trees.
