# DAIRY HINTS

**MILK RECORDS AID DAIRYMAN**  
Both Profitable and Practicable to Know for Certainty the Full Value of Cows.

(Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture)  
Reports coming to the United States Department of Agriculture often include stories of the surprises which cow owners meet with when they start keeping records of their cows' production. For instance, in a Missouri cow-testing association there was a man who, when he entered the association, did not appear to have a very good

herd; but among his cows was a crippled, ten-year-old Jersey named Goldie. Old Goldie led the whole association, with an annual production of approximately 9,300 pounds of milk and 526 pounds of fat, and an income over cost of feed amounting to \$267. In spite of the fact that when the test started she had already gone three months since freshening. The amusing part of Goldie's record is that her owner tried to sell her just before she went on test, for \$75. Six months later he refused \$275 for her. The whole herd of which Goldie was a part averaged over 300 pounds of fat for the year. In contrast with this was another herd of 37 cows in the same association, which had been reputed to be the best in that part of the state. Yet 14 of these were sold during the year as unprofitable, and it seemed likely that more of them would be.

Similar stories come from other states. The dairy division has been giving a great deal of time to the extension of cow-testing associations throughout the country, and there are now nearly 500 associations in various states. The man who joins a cow-testing association never runs the risk of selling a \$200 milk producer for \$50 because her appearance is poor, nor of wasting his feedstuffs and work on a good-for-nothing cow because she looks like a good milker.

It is both profitable and practicable to know for a certainty the worth of a cow by weighing her milk. A man in a cow-testing association has the milk of every cow weighed and tested once a month, from which it is easy to calculate the total for a year. He saves the trouble of doing it himself by having the cow tester do it. The tester also weighs the feed, and figures out the cost of the milk; so that at the end of a year the owner of a herd of cows knows exactly what each one has given, what she has eaten, and how much income over cost of feed she has brought him.

**Acree of Alfalfa.**  
There is an encouraging interest in increasing the acreage of alfalfa on the well-adapted soils in the Middle West.

A good location for the incubator means that it should be convenient for the caretaker as well as suitably located for good hatching conditions.

In feeding young ducks, a handful of clean sand should be mixed with every half bucket of soft feed. It is also a good thing for old stock.

# GOOD HIGHWAYS

## FEDERAL AID FOR HIGHWAYS

Approval Given for 855 Projects Up to September 30, 1920—Western States Lead.

(Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture)  
Federal aid for the construction of 9,630 miles of national highways has been approved by the United States Department of Agriculture. Up to September 30, 1920, approval had been given for 855 projects, which form links in one or the other of the 24 marked trails which have been laid out by private associations to cross the country from East to West and North to South.

The mileage which will be constructed with federal aid on each of the several trails is shown in the following table:

The extent to which federal aid has been applied to the trails varies in the different states. Naturally, the Western states are using much more of the federal apportionments in developing roads of this character than the Eastern states. This is due to the fact that the routes in the Eastern states already had been improved to a large extent before the roads were selected by the pathfinders. This was not true in the West, where long stretches of the selected roads were still in an unimproved condition when they were designated.

Nevada leads in its use of federal funds on roads of this character. Eighty-three per cent of its entire mileage of approved federal-aid roads lies on one or the other of the trails which cross the states. On these roads Nevada will spend 90 per cent of the federal money which has been granted to her.

Indiana is a close second, with 80 per cent of its entire federal-aid mileage and 83 per cent of its money aid

applied to the construction of the trails; and Oklahoma, with 76 per cent of its mileage and 81 per cent of its federal funds, is not far behind. Florida takes the lead in the percentage of its funds which will be used for trail building, with 94 per cent of its federal allotments so applied; but this amount will be spent for only 56 per cent of the mileage which has been approved in the state.

In addition to the above, the states of Illinois, Kansas, Montana, New Mexico, Utah, and Washington are each using 50 per cent or more of their federal money for the upbuilding of the trails.

**Life of Concrete Road.**  
The life of a good concrete road should be at least twenty years and it would seem that this country could afford to spend a large sum of money in the development of such highways if the money were put into roads which will last at least twenty years under motortruck traffic. Experts here and abroad believe that the concrete road is good for much longer than twenty years.

**Salary of Engineers.**  
Chief highway engineers of California and New Jersey are paid at the rate of \$10,000 a year.

**Movement On to Bar German-Made Films**  
New York.—Movements are underway here to bar the further importation of motion pictures made in Germany, either by tariff legislation or other means. Agitation against the German films was started in the American Legion, the report of which led Major Cornelius W. Wickersham, one of the officials of the legion, to state he would present the matter to the American committee.

Independent producers, led by John Emerson, both as movie director and as president of the Actors' Equity association, prepared to appeal to congress for protection against the films, and the equity will back the movement as a safeguard against the throwing out of employment of American movie actors. The Motion Picture Directors' association held a meeting to consider opposition to such importations, which the film makers declare will ruin the home industry if persisted in.

**Correct Way to Receive Burglar.**  
The old plan of offering a burglar a cigarette and asking him to take a chair while you telephone to the police is not now so successful as in the past. The best plan is to tackle the fellow right away. For this purpose you should step behind him, take hold of his coat and force it over his face.
