The annual school election Monday turned out the biggest crowd for a number of years. Three candidates F. C. Frederickson, Merrill E. Doble and A. H. Allen were put up for director and Mr. Frederickson was elected by majority vote. M. F. Wadsworth was re-elected clerk for the ensuing year. The special election was held immediately following the annual meeting and vote taken on construction of a 12 inch pipe line from lateral 16 to the school grounds and carried by a big majority. It is somewhat of a shame that this was not done last year even before the new building was constructed as the grounds look barren or very much like a building without a roof or a coat of paint. We have eight acres in the school grounds and the people have a right to demand this be taken care of since it has been purchased.

The school board has hired Prof. F. G. Grover of Monmouth as principal for the coming term who comes highly recommended and we hope to have a very successful year. Among the other teachers already hired are W. T. Eggleston and Mrs. J. W. Warner of Irrigon.

Oscar was graduated from the Albany college on June 9th and has been elected Principal of Florence, Oregon high school with a salary of fifteen hundred dollars for the term and his wife assistant principal with salary of eleven hundred and twenty-five dollars for the term. This board requested that they first obtain some experience in teaching, which is the work they will take up in the foreign field. In addition to teaching in the high school at Florence, Oscar will be Pastor of the Presbyterian church of that place which has been without a pastor for some time.
