News of an accident happening to the daughter of Rev. M. R. Gallagher well known former resident of Hermiston came to friends here recently.

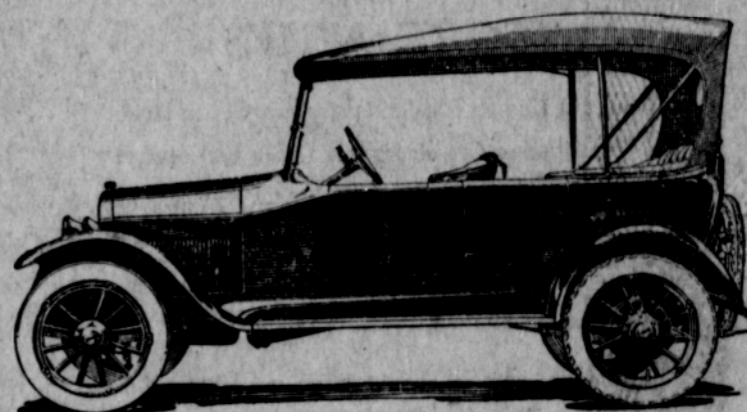
