TONNAGE ON COUNTRY ROADS
 Report of Bureau of Markets Shows Extent to Which Highways Are Being Used.
 The necessity of keeping country roads in good condition is shown by a report recently compiled by the bureau of markets and crop estimates, United States Department of Agriculture, showing the extent to which they are used in hauling farm products to market. According to the report, which shows the tonnage of 11 products hauled on country roads, giving the yearly average for the period from 1915 to 1919, there were 27 tons of these 11 crops hauled for every 100 acres of land. The average tonnage of the 11 crops hauled on country roads each year for the period mentioned amounted to 86,500,000 tons. The 11 crops referred to in the report are corn, wheat, oats, barley, rye, rice, flaxseed, cotton (including seed), tobacco, potatoes, and cultivated hay.

THE BALLOT.
IN ORDER to keep votes and opinions secret the ancients resorted to some form of vote. The Greeks used oyster shells (ostrakon) to vote on the banishment or ostracism of men; the Romans used tablets or tabellae. The printed ballot was used in the New England colonies in the earliest days of their history, but its use in Europe was not until later. In 1710 it was proposed by the English parliament but was rejected. The French chamber of deputies used it in 1840-1845.

STATE NEWS IN BRIEF.

Corvallis.—The budget for the city of Corvallis was published this week, according to the new law, and shows a total estimated expenditure for 1922 of \$57,118.
Cottage Grove.—A number of cattle and sheep in the Lorane neighborhood have died recently from some mysterious cause, which the owners suspect to be the eating of poisonous toadstools, that have been numerous in the woods of that section.
Gardiner.—John Fairchild, proprietor of a Reedsport confectionery, was struck on the head by a robber Saturday night and \$250 was taken. The robber escaped.
Medford.—Jesse H. Duncan, for many years a resident of this city and a painter by trade, was found dead of alcoholism, according to Coroner Perl, in his room Friday morning. Too liberal drinking of bay rum extract is held by the coroner to have brought about death.

Eugene.—A total of 3771 cows in Lane county have been tested for tuberculosis since the testing work was taken up last summer, according to a report made by Ira P. Whitney, county agent, at a meeting of the executive committee of the Lane county agricultural council.
Salem.—The voters of the Turner school district, at a special election held Saturday, went on record favoring a bond issue of \$25,000 for the erection of a high school building to replace the present structure, which has been in use for many years. Only 22 votes were registered against the bond issue.

Albany.—Edgar Lowden of Crawfordville was convicted in the justice court here Saturday on a charge of having deer meat in his possession unlawfully and was fined \$50. He promptly appealed the case to the state circuit court and gave bonds pending the trial in that court at the coming December term.
Eugene.—R. A. Booth, chairman of the state highway commission, who underwent a surgical operation in Portland a short time ago and who was later removed to his home in Eugene, is now able to be about the streets, but says he will not be able to attend to business or sessions of the commission for some time yet.

Salem.—Not one complaint was filed with the state board of forestry here with relation to excessive assessments levied against timber owners for fire patrol service during the 1921 season. Hearing of these objections is made incumbent upon the state board of forestry under a law enacted at the last session of the legislature.
Brownsville.—F. J. Tschauer, Brownsville farmer, thinks that his yield of corn this season was a record breaker for the Willamette valley. He raised 400 bushels of corn on four acres of ground. It is said here that this yield would be a bumper crop even in the middle west corn-growing belt. Mr. Tschauer's farm is one of the richest in the Calapooia river valley.

Salem.—Approximately \$20,000 worth of stock in the Willamette Valley Flax and Hemp Growers' association has been subscribed to by farmers of this vicinity, according to a report of I. J. Hayford, chairman of the Flax Growers' association, which met here Saturday. The Flax Growers' association and the Flax and Hemp Growers' corporation are separate organizations.
Salem.—A hearse, if the maximum load capacity is one ton or more, is considered a truck under the motor vehicle laws, according to a legal opinion given here Saturday by the attorney-general. If the carrying load capacity is less than one ton, the hearse would be classed as an automobile, the attorney-general said. The opinion was asked by Sam A. Kozier, secretary of state.

Salem.—Sam A. Kozier, secretary of state, Saturday night issued orders to George Dunsford, superintendent of capitol buildings and grounds, to start preparations for the special session of the legislature to convene in Salem Monday, December 19. It will require about two weeks to put the buildings in condition for the session, Mr. Dunsford said. The state industrial accident commission is now using the senate chamber, while the motor vehicle department has a force of stenographers and clerks working in the house of representatives. Both of these houses will have to be vacated by the state departments to provide accommodations for the legislators. All of the committee and hearing rooms also are being used by the various state departments, and these will have to be cleared prior to the opening of the session.
