**Estimated Apple Crop.** Estimates are for an American apple crop of about 18,000,000 barrels. Last year 30,000,000 barrels were grown.  
**Prevent Winter Injury.** Cornstalks or hay wound around smooth-barked trees often saves them from winter injury.  
**Value of Spraying.** The value of spraying was demonstrated again this year, in spite of the small apple crop.

# STATE NEWS IN-BRIEF.

**Eugene.**—A portion of the logging camp of the Booth-Kelly Lumber company above Wendling will resume operations about January 10 if the market continues favorable, according to A. C. Dixon, manager of the company.

**Salem.**—There are 14,462 persons of school age in Marion county, according to annual reports received at the offices of the county school superintendent from the various school districts. This is an increase of 397 over the year 1920.

**Albany.**—When Walter Kors, 22, of Tangent found \$100 in Tangent about a month ago he thought he was in luck. Sunday he was arrested and jailed. He confessed to Sheriff Kendall he had found the money and spent it without disclosing the discovery to anyone.

**Astoria.**—November was an exceedingly damp month in the lower Columbia river district, the records in Weather Observer Rosenberg's office showing the rainfall during the month was 19.35 inches. With one exception this was the heaviest rainfall in this section for many years.

**Eugene.**—Little damage was done to the Pacific highway in Lane county by the recent freshet, according to J. R. McKy, county roadmaster. About the only loss, he said, was the washing away of the gravel shoulder in a number of places, but this can be replaced with but little expense.

**Silverton.**—A Mrs. Amstead of Mount Angel was brought to the Silverton hospital after a serious accident in a laundry where she was working a mangle, and lost both hands. Mrs. Amstead is a widow with four children. At present the oldest son, a lad of 17, is trying to find work at Silverton.

**Salem.**—Many telegrams are being received at the office of Governor Olcott and W. H. Lytle, state veterinarian, protesting against an order issued recently by Governor Stephens of California, which prohibits the removal of Oregon sheep into the Modoc federal forest for winter grazing until they have been dipped.

**Canby.**—George Brown, the "potato king" of Clackamas county, whose farm is located near New Era, has harvested this year 4500 bushels of potatoes from a 32-acre tract. These are White Rose and Peerless varieties, and have been stored away in the big storehouse recently completed on the Brown place.

**Hood River.**—Dan Wulle & Co., who shipped 20,000 boxes of apples from Portland to England aboard the steamer Northumberland, due to reach there the later part of this week, are expecting fair returns on the fruit. Reports from the London and other British markets, indicate that an average price of around \$1.80 will be returned to growers here.

**Portland.**—Government hunters and trappers employed by the predatory animal division of the department of agriculture have been responsible for the destruction of 156,150 wild animals, according to a report that has been issued. The campaign has covered a period of six years. During this time, in Oregon, there were 12,524 animals killed.

**Gold Hill.**—There is a movement on foot to re-water Sardine Creek valley on an extensive scale and bring a larger acreage under irrigation. The present system diverted from this stream is inadequate to supply the growing demand. This area is the richest in natural resources of any part of the Gold Hill district.

**Baker.**—The Oregon Lumber company has let the contract for building a five-mile railroad from Bates Inn to its timber property to J. A. Hoskins of this city. Mr. Hoskins will ship supplies to that city and will begin the steel work immediately. About 50 men will be employed. Mr. Hoskins also has a 2,500,000-foot logging contract with the Baker White Pine Lumber company and has a large force of men at work on this contract.

**Salem.**—Governor Olcott, in a letter issued Saturday, endorsed Oregon Industries week, January 23 to 28, inclusive. "The purpose of the movement is a laudable one, to stimulate the public's interest in and purchase and consumption of Oregon manufactured products," said the governor's letter. "I am advised that plans are being laid for bringing to the attention of the people in every possible manner the benefits to be derived from the widest possible use of Oregon products by Oregon people. By showing faith in these products through their use we are developing home industries at a time when such industries need all the impetus that can be given them. Loyalty of home people to these industries will be one of the biggest factors in their success."

**White Stains on Hardwood.**  
A mixture of salt and olive oil will remove white stains from hardwood which are caused by hot dishes. The dry spot is covered thickly with salt, and then as much olive oil is poured over as the grains will take up. This stands over night, and in the morning the discoloration should be briskly rubbed with the mixture, which is then wiped off. If there is still any trace of stain, the application is repeated, again standing for hours.
