tion into Portland by the present method of locks at the falls. The rapid waters and the shallow waters are still in the river; the improvement which has been made upon the river has been some factor in railroad rates and some value to Oregon but the ultimate consideration to be

reached is to drown out the rapids of the river until vessels of greater draught and less engine power can navigate the stream economically. The Umatilla Rapids installation will be first unit in the ultimate development of the river.

"The reclamation of the lands will mean production in unlimited quantities. These factors combined will bring new population, new wealth, new industry and new commerce. It has been said that the improvement of the Umatilla Rapids will create a new producing district which will be substantially equal in the quantity of its production, to the whole Willamette valley. The development of this project then means that we have brought to Portland's door a new Willamette valley. It will be the first step in a river development of such tremendous and striking worth that it will be commanding the attention of all the world. It will make available, cheap power that will itself focus all eyes upon Oregon; it will set the example for further development upon the Columbia River; it will, in fact, bring to Oregon and almost at the very doors of Oregon's metropolises, a wonderfully rich, thriving district where there is now almost nothing.
