The Nutrition class that was to have met Friday of this week has been postponed to Wednesday, Sept. 20. Mrs. Van Deusen is unable to be present.

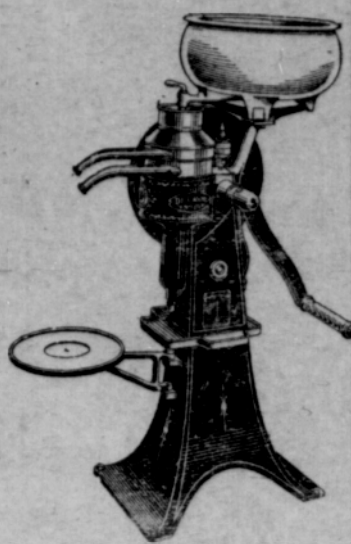
Mrs. S. L. Larson who is at the Pendleton hospital where she went a week ago Sunday for an operation for appendicitis is reported as slowly improving.
