NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that a special election is hereby called, to be held at the High School Building, Union High School District No. 5, at Hermiston, Umatilla County, Oregon, on the 25th day of November, 1922, between the hours of 2 o'clock p. m. and 7 o'clock p. m., and that there will then be submitted to the legal voters thereof the question of levying, within said District, a tax sufficient to raise the sum of \$32,082.82 for the purpose of maintaining and operating a Union High School in said District for the fiscal year beginning June 19, 1922 and ending June 18, 1923, which said money, so raised, to be disbursed in accordance with the provisions of the Budget for said School District as heretofore adopted by the Board of Directors thereof, and which is as follows:

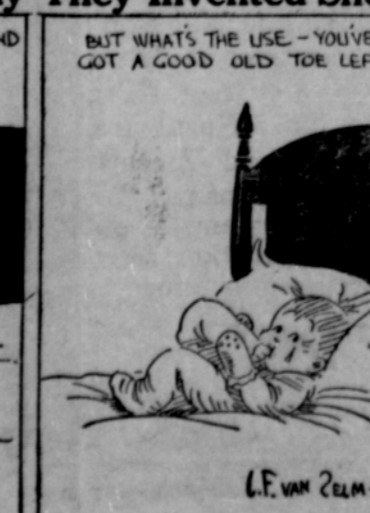
