IS FIRST WOMAN TO SCALE ANDES

Mrs. Marjorie Howarth of New York Makes Trip With Her Husband.

LIVES ON GAME AND FRUIT

Covers a Wild Trail 885 Miles Long—Saw No Monsters but Many Snakes and Bats—Husband Sick on Trip.

New York.—The first white woman to cross the highest peaks of the third range of the Andes mountains, 14,600 feet above sea level, and then to descend and proceed over the difficult trail extending over land and water for 885 miles from Quito, Ecuador, to Iquitos, Peru, on the upper reaches of the Amazon, is Mrs. Marjorie Howarth, wife of a New York business man.

"I had no idea of making such a trip when my husband and I left New York last March, planning merely for a pleasure outing in South America," said Mrs. Howarth at her home. "But when we decided to go over what is known as the Papallacta-Napo route, the American charge d'affaires at Quito, Harold Deane, gave us all the assistance possible. He advised us as to guides, who were Indians, of course, and several groups of these, who were changed at different points for new guides, were the only human beings we saw during most of the trip.

"It was pointed out to us that the trip might be dangerous to any one, especially so to a woman because of the hardship, and that legend had not recorded that a white woman had ever attempted the task. That decided me to accompany my husband, as I thought it was time an American woman should venture over the trail, which follows closely the line of the equator.

"I want to say right here that we came across no monsters or any other strange creatures of the jungle, though there were plenty of animals, but they did not approach us closely, and I shot none, nor did I make any scientific discoveries.
