 Claude Haddock entertained a large group of high school students at a delightful party at his home in Columbia, March 17. Games were enjoyed during the evening and a lunch

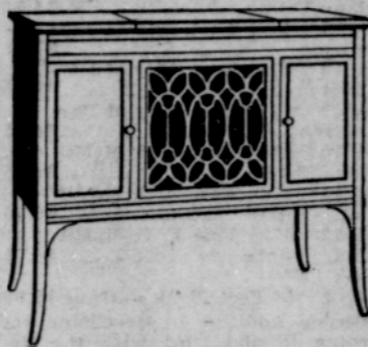
consisting of cake, salad and punch was served.
