Since the opening of her career she has produced more than fifty novels, in addition to innumerable short stories and articles.—Exchange.

Increased Demand for Grapes. Shipment of grapes in 1922 from the three leading grape-growing states in the East—New York, Michigan, and Pennsylvania—was double their average annual shipments, according to reports to the United States Department of Agriculture. New York shipped 7,484 cars, compared with an average of 3,584 for the years 1917-1921; Michigan shipped 5,833 cars, compared with an average of 2,912; and Pennsylvania, 1,514, compared with 737.

Plants Turned Into Paper. A Mexican has invented a process for making paper pulp from the fiber of the various plants that grow in abundance all over Mexico. It is claimed that the entire process—from the crude plant to the perfect state for paper purposes—is accomplished in 24 hours, and at a comparatively low cost.
