by the Common Council will be printed on the official ballot: REFERRED TO THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF HERMISTON BY THE COMMON COUNCIL.

Charter amendment limiting the assessments, to be levied for street improvements to the actual cost thereof as apportioned to the property benefited and to authorize the council by ordinance or agreement with property owners to provide for paying all or part of any street improvements from the general tax funds.

ORDINANCE No. 111
 An ordinance to amend subdivisions 11 and 14 of Section 102 of the Charter of the City of Hermiston and to submit and refer this ordinance to the voters of said City for the approval or rejection.

The City of Hermiston does ordain as follows:
 Sec. 1. That subdivision 11 of section 102 of the Charter of the City of Hermiston be, and the same hereby is amended so as to read as follows:

Subdivision 11. No lot, part thereof or parcel of land shall be assessed for any local or special improvement in excess of the actual cost of such improvement as apportioned to said land and in just proportion to the cost of the entire improvement of the local improvement district in which such land is situated, except upon the express consent of the owner of such land, or his duly authorized agent, first obtained in writing.

Sec. 2. That subdivision 14 of Section 102 of the charter of the City of Hermiston be, and the same hereby is amended so as to read as follows:

Subdivision 14. Where the estimated assessment against any lot, part of lot or parcel of land for any local improvement appears to the common council as excessive or out of proportion to the special benefits to be derived by the property by reason of such local improvement, and where the improvement of a street in any local improvement district appears to the council to be of general benefit and value to all the inhabitants of the city, the common council may, by ordinance appropriate a sufficient amount from the general tax or special tax funds of the City to pay for so much of the cost of such local improvements as shall not be provided for by assessment upon the property specially benefited by such improvement, and the council may, by agreement with the property owners in any local improvement district, provide for payment by the City of a just and fair proportion of the cost of improving any street or roadway within the City. The council shall also have the power and authority to create a special fund of the City for the purpose of paying all or such portion of any street improvement as it may deem just and fair to the City and to the property owners specially benefited thereby, and also for the purpose of keeping the streets so improved in repair. The council may by ordinance whenever expedient or necessary to complete any street improvement undertaken by it, authorize the issuance of warrants in payment thereof and fix the terms and conditions of payment by the City and by the property owners specially benefited by any such improvement.

Sec. 3. All acts or parts of acts in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
 Sec. 4. This ordinance shall be referred to the voters of the City of Hermiston for their approval or rejection at the next regular or special election to be held in said city.

 Notice is hereby given that a special election will be held in the City of Hermiston, Umatilla County, Oregon, on the 30th day of November, 1923, between the hours of 8 o'clock A. M. and 8 o'clock P. M. of said day at the City Council room in the Library in said City, for the purpose of adopting or rejecting a certain ordinance for said City proposed by the common council of said City in Ordinance No. 111 passed by said council and signed by the Mayor on October 17, 1923, being a proposal for amending subdivisions 11 and 14 of Section 102 of the Charter of said City, which ordinance and proposed ordinance was filed in the office of the City Recorder on October 17, 1923.

Ordinance No. 112
 To submit to the legal voters of the City of Hermiston Ordinance No. 111 proposed by the common council and now on file with the City Recorder and providing for a special election to be held in said City on the 30th day of November, 1923.

The City of Hermiston does ordain as follows:
 Sec. 1. That there shall be held in the City of Hermiston, Oregon, on Friday, the 30th day of November, 1923, between the hours of 8 o'clock A. M. and 8 o'clock P. M. of said day at the City Council room in the Library in the said City, a special City election for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said City all measures that may be submitted and proposed by initiative petition and filed in the office of the City Recorder and also that certain Ordinance No. 111 proposed by the Common Council and approved by the Mayor and filed in the office of the City Recorder on October 17th, 1923 proposing to amend subdivisions Nos. 11 and 14 of Section 102 of the Charter of the City of Hermiston, which said measure, together with the ballot numbers and ballot title thereof is as follows:

Sec. 3. The City Recorder shall cause to be published in the Hermiston Herald a complete copy of this ordinance together with the ballot title and ballot number of said measure which publication shall run in two issues thereof consecutively within the 30 days prior to the date of said election.
