We Need the Money

Dyes Used to Color Growing Trees.

A method of coloring the wood of growing trees has been devised by a German engineer, who has been able to color the tree any shade while it is still growing. Various aniline dyes are used, which do not poison the tree or affect its growth. The entire tree, from the very ends of its roots to the remotest branch and leaf, can be colored any desirable shade within 48 hours after the solution of the dye-stuff is injected into the roots.

About 50 grams of the dye are used to 20 liters of water. The sap of the tree carries the coloring matter throughout the structure.

This new development opens up many possibilities of obtaining novel and startling effects in the novelty business, and it also makes possible the perfect imitation of certain natural woods. It is reported certain Dutch and American interests are giving this process serious attention.
