ORDINANCE No. 115  
An Ordinance to amend the Charter of the City of Hermiston by adding thereto section 134 and to submit and refer this ordinance to the legal voters of said City for their approval or rejection.  
The City of Hermiston does ordain as follows:  
Sec. 1. That the charter of the City of Hermiston be, and the same hereby is amended by adding thereto section 134 as follows: Sec. 134. All funds derived from the City Water System and all funds here-

after placed in the fund of the City Water System shall be kept in a fund separate from all other City funds and shall not be used for any purpose other than for the expense of operating and maintaining said Water System and for betterments and extensions thereto and for the purpose of paying interest and principal of water bonds.

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall be referred to the legal voters of the City of Hermiston for their approval or rejection at the next regular election to be held in said City.
