SULFUR HELPS LEGUMES ON MANY OREGON SOILS
Sulfur applied to Oregon soils gives greater yields, especially when applied to legumes and plants of the cabbage family, which need more sulfur than phosphorus, says the experiment station.
Sulfur is often insufficient in arid and semi-arid sections of Oregon. Applying 80 to 100 pounds per acre every 3 to 4 years has given one ton or more increase in yield of legume hay per season, according to the data of the college experiment station. Fall application of sulfur should be practiced under cold conditions or under heavy or dry soils as sulfur oxidizes slowly to the sulfate form, in which form it is available to the crop.
Ground sulfur is commonly used, and can be applied with a land plaster spreader or by hand to the ground. Gypsum contains sulfur to the amount of about 18 pounds per 100, but the application of sulfur is the more profitable in certain sections as is shown by the data from the Deschutes valley experiments. A crop from plots to which sulfur was added yielded \$18 increase in crop value, whereas the plots to which gypsum was added yielded only \$6.50 less than half as much.
Sulfur helps to hold calcium and other bases in solution and legumes are lime loving plants. Sulfur increased the protein content and feed value of alfalfa. It also improves the reaction of arid soils for alfalfa. The green pigment and capacity of plant is increased for the use of the sun's energy and for the formation of carbohydrates, or the dry food stuffs.

24 OREGON COUNTIES HAVE COUNTY AGENTS

All Oregon counties with agricultural agents 1st year have continued for this year and three additional counties have joined the group—Lane, Coos and Grant. The first two are renewing the plan after 12 years' trial except for the last two years, while Grant is trying it out for the first time.
The counties carrying the agent policy cooperate with the state college extension service and the federal department of agriculture. The extension service includes 30 of the 36 counties of the state in its cooperative work, which is now closely organized in four-fifths of the counties, as follows:
Union, Lincoln, Umatilla, Malheur, Benton, Jackson, Baker, Douglas, Wasco, Multnomah, Klamath, Clackamas, Josephine, Lake, Deschutes, Clatsop, Washington, Morrow, Columbia, Tillamook, Crook, Linn, Marion, Polk, Yamhill, Lane, Coos and Grant counties.
The Grant county agent is D. E. Richards, reports F. L. Ballard, state county agent leader. He is a graduate of the state college and former member of the faculty. He has been county agent in Lake county and also livestock inspector for the Ladd and Tilton bank, Portland. He has organized control against rodents and grass hoppers and finds much interest in improving alfalfa stands

and in farm dairy herds and sheep flocks. Renewal work on the once famous orchards of the John Day valley is another project scheduled for early consideration.
Another Richards, Clyde R., who is a graduate of the University of Idaho, is the agent for Coos county. He has been a successful county agent in Idaho for three years and has had extensive training in dairying and experience on dairy farms.

FARM REMINDERS
European canker is wide spread in western Oregon occasionally causing a severe damage to certain pear varieties. Specimens of pear cankers may be referred to the experiment station at Corvallis for free diagnosis. These cankers increase from year to year. Control consists in the thorough cutting out and disinfection of the existing cankers, followed by a summer Bordeaux spray as employed for anthracnose.
