The members of the Epworth League will hold a cooked food sale on Saturday, June 6, at Sappers store.

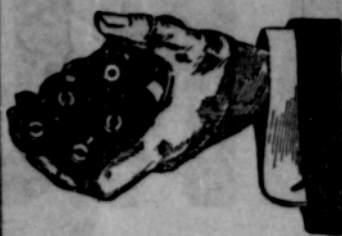
