Restoring Soiled Table
Heat stains may be removed from a highly polished table by applying the following in their respective order, using a separate cloth for each: Keroseene, alcohol and sweet or linseed oil. The last should be well rubbed in until the spot no longer shows. Frequently a cloth moistened with warm camphorated oil will remove the stain. If these methods fail, probably the table will have to be refinished.
