CITY IRRIGATION WATER ASSESSMENT FOR 1926.

Notice is hereby given that, in accordance with Ordinance No. 96 of the City of Hermiston, an assessment has been levied upon and against the following lots and parcels of land in the irrigation District hereinbefore established in the City of Hermiston in the amounts set forth below.

The total amount of assessment in said irrigation District is \$508.83. The contract price to be paid for Government water and O. & M. charge is \$201.82.

The estimated Operation and Maintenance charge in said district for 1926 is \$307.01.

The City Council will sit as a Board of Equalization at 8 o'clock on Wednesday evening, March 17, 1926, and will at said time examine said assessment roll and correct all errors therein. Any person feeling himself or herself aggrieved by such assessment may apply to the City Council, when that body sits as a Board of Equalization and an opportunity will be given them to have such assessment changed, if in the opinion of the City Council such changes are just.
