Partridge Has Hard Time

The English partridge has to fight against many conditions and odds in its battle for existence and naturalists there tell many interesting stories of contests in which the birds are engaged, there being a large number of natural enemies ready to slay the bird or rob the nests of eggs and young.

The seasons are bad; the cold rains cause the death of many young birds; the fox forever is after the partridge. The birds hunt secluded places for their nests and have been known to build a new nest about the eggs that have been tumbled down when the nest was wrecked by accident.

Famous French Assembly

The name "French Directory" was given to the body of five individuals (Lepeaux, Rewbell, Letourneur, Barras and Carnot), to whom was entrusted the administration of public affairs in France at the time of the revolution. The directory was established by the Constitution of the fifth Fructidor (August 22, 1795), and ruled in conjunction with the Council of Ancients of Five Hundred. It lasted about four years, when, owing to its corruption and inefficiency, it was overthrown by the coup d'etat of the eighteenth Brumaire (November 9, 1799), planned by Napoleon Bonaparte.—Kansas City Times.
