Notice is hereby given that by virtue of the authority of the City Charter of the City of Hermiston and the direction of the City Council authorizing and directing the Treasurer of the City of Hermiston to collect the unpaid assessments for the city irrigation water for the year 1927, levied and imposed under the provisions of Ordinance No. 76 passed by the City Council and approved by the Mayor on July 2, 1913, as amended by Ordinance No. 122 and ordinance No. 96 passed by the City Council and approved by the Mayor on April 17, 1918.
