FARM REMINDERS

Where clover for seed is badly infested with honeydew it is seldom advisable to stack it unless it is known that no huller will be available until late, says the experiment station. Some Oregon growers prefer to have such rained on to wash out the honeydew before putting it in the stack.

Botulinus poisoning in fowls is not uncommon where spoiled canned foods such as peas, beans, corn and the like are carelessly thrown out where they eat it. Symptoms are hunched neck and a general sleepy condition. About the only method of treatment is to empty the crop, either lancing it and sewing it up again or by flushing it out by running the crop full of water from a hot water bottle, then holding the head down and forcing it out, says the poultry pathologist of the experiment station.

Where decay occurs as the result of washing fruit it is always caused by improper methods, such as deep submersion, poor rinsing or rough handling. Where careful methods are used decay in storage has been greatly lessened as compared with unwashed fruit, reports the experiment station.

The sooner old berry canes are cut and burned after the bearing season is over the quicker disease and insect pests will be destroyed.

Where dairy herd is being feed from contagious abortion, reactors are kept isolated from other animals of the herd, though they may be kept successfully as near as 200 yards of the main barn if proper precautions are taken. The two herds are never allowed to mingle nor are the free animals allowed to pasture where others have been recently kept.

Tonsils Are Removed

Roe McPaul, project farmer, who has been ill in the sanitarium at College Place, Washington, for several weeks, had his tonsils removed about a week ago in an effort to hasten his recovery. His condition is reported to be somewhat improved.
