C.—Farmers are intending to sow this fall an acreage of winter wheat 2.1 per cent less and an acreage of rye 8.6 per cent greater than last year, the department of agriculture announced after compiling farmers' intentions as expressed August 1. Intentions as to winter wheat, if carried out, would mean a total area of 46,523,000 acres, compared with 46,535,000 acres planted last year.
