FARM REMINDERS

Time of seeding fall wheat may often be a factor in controlling weeds. Wheat which is seeded early in the fall is often infested with annual weeds in some parts of Oregon. Weed infestations can be materially reduced by cultivation of the seed bed in the fall and delaying planting until many of the weeds have opportunity to germinate. In most seasons in Western Oregon planting can safely be delayed until October 15-20. In date of planting trials with winter wheat by the Oregon experiment station at Corvallis, this date of planting has given the highest yields in comparison with earlier and later seedings. Wheat planted before Oct. 1 is often more heavily infested with weeds, while that planted much after October 20 generally does not have an opportunity to become well established.

Grain from sweet sorghums is not as good as cow feed as that of the real grain sorghums such as milo and feterita. These grain sorghums have about the same composition as corn, finds the experiment station. They are ground before being fed.

STATE MARKET AGENT DEPARTMENT

The Army of Co-operatives

Three million members, shareholders, shippers, consignors and patrons are credited to the 11,400 active co-operative associations, according to an estimate by U. S. department of agriculture. The estimates for a number of the largest groups of organizations are: grain marketing, 900,000 members; dairy products, 600,000; livestock, 450,000; fruit and vegetables, 215,000; cotton, 140,000; miscellaneous products, 190,000; buying supplies, 398,000. The membership figures of 3,000,000 does not mean the number of individuals in the activities of the associations; many farmers hold memberships in two or more. The number of different individuals is about 2,000,000.

Sheep Increasing in Numbers

Sheep in the United States are recovering from the slump of a few years ago and are again increasing. This year the estimate is 44,545,000 head, against 51,929,000 as an average of 1909 and 1913. In Australia, the leading exporter of wool, a preliminary estimate for the year places sheep at 103,000,000 head, a slight decrease below 1926, but an increase of about 11,000,000 over the pre-war level. In 25 countries of the world reporting all years to 1927, sheep numbers amount to 395,000,000 head, an increase of 1.8 per cent over 1926, and 3.6 per cent over the 1909-1913 average.

Pasteurize or Boil Milk

"Undulant Fever" is a new disease in Oregon and is said to be caused by the use of milk from cows that have prematurely lost their young, a condition known as "contagious abortion," which the state veterinarian claims to be existing in between 5 and 10 per cent of Willamette valley herds. The disease last about three months but is rarely fatal. The authorities say: "The existence of undulant fever in Oregon is another argument for pasteurization of milk. In rural communities where pasteurization plants are not available, milk from infected cows should be boiled before drinking."

Boston Man Heads Foreign War Vets. Indianapolis, Ind.—Eugene P. Carver Jr. of Boston, Mass., was elected national commander in chief of the Veterans of Foreign Wars at their 29th encampment here. He won over Patrick W. Kelley of Portland, department commander of Oregon, the only other candidate. Mrs. Bessie Hanks of Revere, Mass., was elected president of the Women's auxiliary.
