Plan Spring Planting Needs

Late fall is the time of year to start figuring on next spring's plant growing supplies. Plant boxes can be made during the winter so one will not have to bother with them during the spring rush. It is better to make them of definite dimensions so they will fit bench or bed in greenhouse or frame. A plant box three inches in depth is ordinarily the best. Other supplies to be considered include soil, dry, rotted manure, and some sandy loam for lightening the soil mixture. It is a good idea to keep these under cover if possible so they will be of good texture when needed. Further details of this work can be obtained from the department of vegetable gardening of Oregon State college.

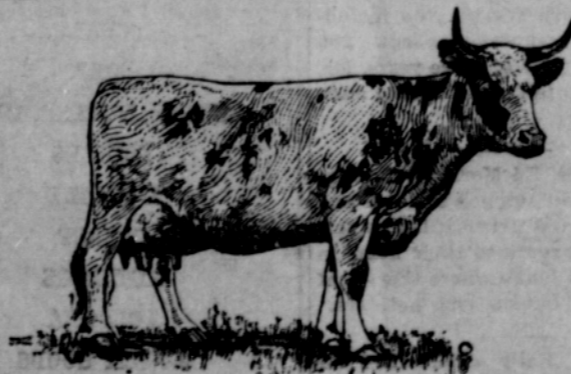
