Kill Trees With Poison

The process of decay is hastened by poisoning the tree while it is still living. Gashes are cut around the trunk of the tree into which a solution of arsenic is poured. The leaves all die within a week or two and decay sets in soon and works rapidly in both tree and roots. In four months worms will be found working in the wood. In two years most of the branches fall. In four years the trunk is gone and the stump can be easily removed in six years.

Much of World Unknown

That five-sevenths of the world remains unmapped, and this must be done before we shall have a true picture of the lands in which we live, was the recent declaration of Dr. Hamilton Rice, the South American explorer. The development of air transportation will greatly stimulate and simplify the task, he believes, after using a small hydroplane and radio sending and receiving apparatus to complete the mapping of 500,000 square miles of heretofore little-known territory in Brazil, Colombia and other countries. Doctor Rice advocates courses in exploration at colleges.

New York Leads All in Orgy of Wasting

In America, waste is an old habit of long standing and not wholly dishonorable descent. It is a legacy of the pioneers, a part of the old American tradition; for with a wilderness to subdue and the wealth of a continent at their doorsteps, the first settlers troubled themselves little over what they wasted. There was plenty more, whereas speed in producing food or clothes or shelter was a matter of life and death. So the tradition became established; and the descendents of the earliest fathers have blithely agreed with the latest immigrants in at least this one American tradition: to get things quickly, to build hastily, to tear down when it is convenient, and to use up at breakneck speed the gifts that the generous gods have lavishly provided.

And as all things American are on their grandest scale in New York. It is there that we must look for an orgy of waste that would have appalled imperial Rome. If the Yankee metropolis is not the most American of cities, either in its culture or its population, it is at least the most observed, both by foreigners and by other cities of the land. It occupies more land, builds higher buildings, handles more business, receives more visitors and attention, lives at a quicker tempo than any other city in America—which means that it wastes on a more lavish and stupendous scale than any other city in the world.—John Bakeless in the Forum.
