CHRISTIAN SCIENCE CHURCHES

"REALITY" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, March 31.

The Golden Text was, "Thou, O Lord, shalt endure for ever; and thy remembrance unto all generations" (Psalms 102:12).

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "While we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen: for the things which are seen are temporal; but the things which are not seen are eternal" (II Cor. 4:18).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passage from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "Life, Truth, and Love are the realities of divine Science. They dawn in faith and glow full-orbed in spiritual understanding. As a cloud hides the sun it cannot extinguish, so false belief silences for a while the voice of immutable harmony, but false belief cannot destroy Science armed with faith, hope and fruition" (p. 238).

Beginning Friday, April 5 Ralph J. Milton, evangelist, will conduct evening meetings at the local Free Methodist church. The services will be

COLLEGE IMPROVEMENTS REDUCE FIRE HAZARDS

Better fire protection for students at Oregon State college has been accomplished by building alterations just carried out at that institution. Some of the older buildings when constructed were not provided with stair wells and fire proof doors to separate each floor from the one below and above. These partitions and doors have now been installed in the building, the mines building and the home economics building.

These and some other minor improvements such as installation of stand pipes and fire proof electrical switch compartments place the older buildings on a par with newer structures on the campus which are provided with every fire protection possible with the type of construction used.

Jerusalem artichokes which have been found valuable in many parts of Oregon are practically always planted in the spring, says the experiment station. Soil preparation is such as to provide a deep, reasonably fine seed bed, similar to that for potatoes.
